ERAU Students Help Save Local Pilot in Distress



Two Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University Flight students were flying near Palatka, Florida, when they heard an emergency call over the radio that an 81-year-old pilot nearby had just experienced engine failure at 800 feet. Immediately, they headed in the direction of the call.

"You never panic in an emergency, as panicking will only worsen the situation," said senior Flight instructor Chris

Shields, who was flying along with Aeronautical Science junior Connor Cvetan. "I just kept calm and did what needed to be done to get the individual the help he needed."

First, Shields contacted the pilot in distress and tried to help point out an empty field directly below the aircraft as a possible landing site. "When I saw the plane touch down into the water, my heart sank," said Cvetan. "Our first thought was to try to contact the pilot. No luck. That's when we determined that calling Jacksonville ATC was the best option."

The students could see the pilot standing on top of his plane, which was slowly sinking. They determined the exact coordinates of the crash and relayed them to emergency services. Then they began circling the area, offering updates and information about the aircraft floating in the pond below to the U.S. Navy and Coast Guard over the radio.

Aeronautical Science senior Steven Lange also assisted in the search-and-rescue operation. Lange stepped in to assist emergency services once Shields and Cvetan returned to base to refuel. Thanks to assistance provided by the three Embry-Riddle Flight students, a U.S. Navy MH-60 Seahawk rescued the pilot safely.


Survey Participation Request for Retention of Women in Collegiate Aviation

Republic Airways Gifts \$30,000 to Delaware State University Aviation Department



Dover, DE: A team from Republic Airways visited Delaware State University aviation students on Wednesday, bringing a \$30,000 gift for the program.

More than 20 Delaware State aviation graduates are currently pilots at the regional airlines based in Indianapolis, IN, said Darrell Morton, Senior Manager of Educational Programs for the airlines.

"In an industry dominated by white males, what we want to do is demonstrate that there is a way into this industry and inspire the next generation of pilots," he said. "We have had a lot of success in getting pilots from Delaware State, so it's natural to continue to strengthen the partnership."

Funds will be used for mobile flight simulators and to offset fees and book costs for students, said Lt. Col. (ret) Michael Hales, director of the aviation program. "This helps us make it easier for us to get students to a place where the airlines can hire them," he said.

Col. Hales said the mobile simulators will be used by students and taken to events and shows that he attends, to recruit students to the aviation program.

Hales said Republic and other regional airlines try to attract graduates and word of mouth among students has led to the high number of graduates going to Republic.

Recent Delaware State graduates Maurice Ellis and Jay Shah, now pilots for Republic, said they like to keep track of the progress of students at their alma mater and come back to speak with them about working as a pilot.

Marshall Flight School Student Making Impact on Women in Aviation

KANAWHA COUNTY, W.Va. (WCHS) — Across the country, there is a shortage of pilots, especially women pilots.

Some women are working to head to the skies through training being offered at Marshall University's Bill Noe Flight School at West Virginia International Yeager Airport in Kanawha County.

"I always caught myself looking up at the sky seeing all the airplanes go by, and I always wanted to do that someday," said Kristen Sayre, president of Women in Aviation at the Bill Noe Flight School.

Sayre, a Marshall flight school student, is one of only five women in her class, and the first in her class to do a solo flight.

Sayre and a group of students came together and started West Virginia's very first Women in Aviation chapter. She is proud of the high percentage of female enrollment at the Bill Noe Flight School.

"We have about triple the national average right now," she said.

Sayre said she is also working to see if Marshall will expand its Yeager Scholar Program.

"Chuck Yeager partnered with Marshall University to break the educational barrier of conventionality, and I feel like that is exactly what we are doing here at the Bill Noe Flight School," Sayre said.

Transportation Industry Diversity Survey

OVER 5,000 STUDENTS VISITED UAA at the P2P CAREER EXPO in RIPLEY TN



UAA was pleased to be part of the two-day Pathways2Possibilites (P2P) Career Expo for West TN. Approximately 5,000 middle and high school students from public and private schools throughout West Tennessee were under one roof for this event. P2P is a unique, handson, interactive, career exploration experience designed to give students an opportunity to think about, make decisions, and plan for their career after high school. Each student spent more than 90 minutes on the expo floor exploring and engaging with professionals. As part of the P2P program, UAA was in good company - also on the floor engaging students and promoting collegiate aviation were FedEx, Tennessee College of Applied Technology, and Dyersburg State Community College. Each booth provided information of job fields within aviation: licensure and certification requirements, and expected salary ranges, and education requirements for the field. UAA's booth distributed several hundred free Collegiate Aviation Guides and Collegiate Aviation Scholarship Catalog to students interested in careers in aviation.

Cranfield University Flying Classroom Takes to the Sky



A project to facilitate the training of the next generation of aerospace engineers in the UK's only "flying classroom" is fully operational thanks to the technical expertise of a leading aircraft interior specialist, Starling Aerospace.

Working in partnership with Cranfield University's National Flying Laboratory Centre (NFLC), Starling has completed a six-month program of modification and re-certification of all 35 seats in the NFLC's Saab 340B aircraft, which is the latest educational asset to join the university's fleet.

The project required a bespoke solution for the fitment of computer tablets and other equipment to each seat back of the flying classroom. Starling was responsible for the complete design, fabrication, modification, re-certification and installation process, which provides aerospace engineering students from over 20 universities and

Cranfield to gain invaluable flight test experience as part of their research studies. Operating from Cranfield's Global Research Airport in Bedfordshire, the Saab 340B is unique in the UK in its role to create new research capabilities, including projects which test the development of advanced aerospace technologies and flight operations.

Commenting on the project, Starling's co-founding director, Coralie Wigg, said: "Supporting Cranfield's training program of future aerospace engineers has made this an exceptionally rewarding undertaking for Starling and one that required a complex array of technical challenges to be overcome, regarding bespoke design, parts manufacture and stringent re-certification. Our team of design engineers and fabricators rose to these challenges with great professionalism and we were very proud to have partnered with Cranfield in support of its endeavors."

Richard Jones, aircraft technical manager, National Flying Laboratory Centre, said: "Starling Aerospace delivered a fantastic 'future proof' solution to accommodate the Microsoft Surface Pro tablets in the headrests of the Saab 340 cabin seats, for our flying classroom tutorials. We were equally impressed with the durability and finish of the synthetic leather together with high standard of workmanship achieved by the whole Starling team."



Marshall University Flight School Adds First Multi-Engine Aircraft to Growing Fleet



CHARLESTON, W.Va. (WCHS) — Marshall University's Bill Noe Flight School welcomed its first multi-engine aircraft Friday at West Virginia International Yeager Airport.

The plane is a Piper Seminole model and was flown in from a facility in Vero Beach, Fla. This is the first of several multiengine aircrafts Marshall plans to acquire.

Marshall University President Brad Smith noted the push to start an aviation program began about three years ago.

"The expansion of our program is an example of the success of the program, but also the shared vision we all have for

future possibilities," Smith said.

Bill Noe is the flight school's namesake and the pilot who flew the new plane in to West Virginia. He said the addition of multi-engine planes will allow the program to offer the highest level of certification available in the industry.

The institution is working with the Federal Aviation Administration to offer two academic degree programs at the flight school. Marshall's commercial pilot program opened in fall 2021. The university plans to add an aviation maintenance program later this year.

Participating aviators competed in action-packed events over four days to test the pilot's ability and competency to maneuver and manipulate the aircraft, fly under instrument flight rules (IFR), assess flight computer accuracy, and a variety of other events.

As a first-time host, CAU's Flight Team proudly earned second place overall and won the coveted Red Baron Team Sportsmanship Award, an award voted on by the other teams and judges. CAU also brought home victory as the runner-up in the Flight Events Championship.

Bachelor of Science in Aeronautics students Camille and

Nathan earned first place in the Instrument Simulated Flight and Short Field Landing events, respectively.

All victors were presented their awards during an awards banquet on the last day of the competition. Because of their top scores, CAU's Flight Team earned a bid to the national competition held in Columbus, Ohio in May 2022.

"We're excited to have hosted this year's SAFECON Region Il competition," says CAU President Matthew Johnston. "Our flight team has a lot of fun preparing for these competitions with other students who share their passion for aviation. We're proud of their hard work as they applied what they've learned in class to real-world scenarios in this competition, and we're looking forward to the national competition!"

SAFECON, Safety and Flight Evaluation Conference, is an annual competition consisting of flight and ground challenges designed to promote safety and professionalism among collegiate aviators. Region II encompasses flight teams from California, Nevada, Arizona, Oregon, Washington, Alaska, and Hawaii.

Event judges participated from the local area, including airline pilots, local pilots, and members of the Bakersfield 99s.

Since the event had been cancelled due to COVID concerns, this year's competition was much anticipated for all those involved.

Delta Airlines Partners with Hampton University to Diversify Pilots

Delta Airlines has announced a partnership with Hampton University, a Historically Black College and University (HBCU) in order to diversify their pilot workforce and train more pilots of color.

Only about 3% of commercial airline pilots are Black, and CNN reported that 34,000 new pilots would be needed by 2025 to fill demand. Hampton is the first HBCU Delta has added to its Propel Collegiate Pilot Career Path Program.

"Delta says connecting the world requires that we first respect the world through seeking diversity, promoting inclusion, creating equity, and driving accountability towards these goals," said First Officer Monique Grayson, interviewer for the Propel program. "Considering the history of HBCUs and that of Delta, I am proud to see the company doing just that."

Hampton students who join the program will have a chance to receive a job offer from Delta upon graduation.

New Aircraft Mx Program Coming to New River Community and Technical College

BEAVER, WV – An aircraft maintenance program is now underway at New River Community and Technical College.

With the help of Senator Shelley Moore Capito and Congresswoman Carol Miller, the school is being awarded \$300,000 in federal funds towards the operation. It will be a Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) certified Aircraft Maintenance School (AMTS) with an Airframe and Powerplant (A&P) rating.

"We've seen across the country that there is a need for people working in the aircraft maintenance field," says Director of Communications at New River CTC, Jenni Canterbury. The new program will work with the Raleigh County Memorial Airport and the New River Gorge Regional Development Authority.





Oklahoma State University Celebrates Grand Opening of Ray and Linda Booker OSU Flight Center



Oklahoma State University celebrated an aviation milestone Saturday with the grand opening of the state-of-the-art Ray and Linda Booker OSU Flight Center.

The 11,500 square-foot building replaces OSU Aviation's outdated facilities and more than doubles the space available to students and flight instructors. Building highlights include 35 workstations for flight instructors, debriefing rooms where student pilots will receive feedback, a student lounge and locker room, an academic suite and flight simulation rooms. The facility is located southwest of Stillwater Regional Airport along North Airport Road.


"With this new flight center, we now have a home that matches the energy, passion and success of our students and faculty," said Jon Pedersen, dean of OSU's College of Education and Human Sciences.

He added that enrollment in the aviation program has grown by 40 percent in recent years and that the college has added five new Cirrus SR20 planes to its fleet.

"The Ray and Linda Booker OSU Flight Center puts our program in a position to continue to grow as we attract and retain high-caliber students," Pedersen said. "With common areas, space for individual flight debriefings and more, this incredible building will truly enhance our flight operation and serve our students well."

Oklahoma State University is one of fewer than 20 universities in the U.S. to offer graduate aviation degrees and has become a pipeline for trained professionals to start careers in an industry with a dwindling workforce. In addition to training students to become pilots, OSU Aviation prepares students for careers in aviation management, aerospace security and technical service.

Embraer Launches Educational Partnership Program



Embraer today launched its first U.S.-centric educational partnership program to promote aviation career paths, offering scholarships, grants, and employee volunteer hours to students at select high schools, technical colleges, and universities in the U.S. This initiative will be led by the nonprofit Embraer Foundation and will implement an industry-focused scholarship and internship program to inspire and recruit students to pursue aviation careers. The first scholarships and grants will be for the fall 2022 term.

The program will initially focus on six schools with aviation training programs and will award approximately 20 scholarships and grants, each worth between \$1,000 and \$2,500, as well as internship opportunities. While not yet able to reveal the names of those schools, Embraer Foundation chief Monica Newman McCluney told AIN that the trial period will include three high schools, two technical schools, and one university—some in Florida, where Embraer has several facilities, but also in other states.

According to McCluney, the pilot program allows Embraer to hire entry-level talent and retain a more diverse workforce. Embraer plans to steadily increase the onboarding of talented students from partnership schools over the coming years.

Additionally, Embraer representatives will visit each school to provide academic support and serve in an advisory capacity related to the school's aviation curriculum. Other benefits include hands-on training programs and on-site visits to Embraer's Melbourne campus.

"As one of the leading companies in the aerospace industry, Embraer is invariably focused on innovation and education," said McCluney. "Education has always been at the core of our social responsibility initiatives and our new program reinforces that commitment—not only to inspiring youth through aviation, but to developing a high-performing and diverse talent pipeline. It is crucial that we make social investments that ensure our ability to attract a diverse workforce. These students are the future of our industry, and we are honored to provide additional resources to help them grow and succeed."



USC Joins U.S. Space Force's University Partnership Program



USC President Carol L. Folt has signed a memorandum of understanding with the U.S. Space Force, bringing the university into a select group of academic Space Force partners.

The Space Force's University Partnership Program will bolster research and leadership development for students and faculty. The partnership will enhance STEM study and research projects that foster national security objectives in the space domain. It also will offer scholarship and mentorship opportunities for students, faculty and Air Force cadets. Space Force is an independent military service under the Air Force.

"This is a remarkable and exciting extension of USC's longstanding partnership with the U.S. Armed Forces," Folt said. "Our agreement with the U.S. Space Force creates a new way for members of the Trojan community to serve our country and will leverage USC's strengths in aerospace research and education to help build a diverse force of scientists and engineers who are focused on operating in new realm."

The U.S. Space Force is the newest division of the Armed Forces, established by the National Defense Authorization Act in 2019 as a branch of the military focused on advancing and protecting U.S. and allied interests in space. Lt. Gen. Michael A. Guetlein, commander of Space Systems Command, attended Monday's University Partnership Program ceremony on the University Park Campus on behalf of Vice Chief of Space Operations General David Thompson.

"We are delighted that the University of Southern California is now a part of USSF's University Partnership Program," Guetlein said. "In order to succeed in our mission, the U.S. Space Force needs a highly educated and diverse group of military and civilian guardians who have the technical expertise and problem-solving skills to develop, advance, and operate the world's most advanced space systems today and into the future of our congested and contested space domain."

The FAA award recognized Hoover for her role at CWU and for her many contributions at the regional and national levels through her mentoring efforts, publications, presentations, and backcountry flight instruction. After having time to reflect on the recognition, Hoover says she feels both proud and humbled.


