This could be your opportunity for a rewarding contribution of service to your association and your profession. University Aviation Association (UAA) membership annually elects outstanding members to the governing Board of Trustees.

The Board is comprised of five Officers and fifteen Trustees elected by our membership to represent collegiate institutions and the industry at large.

The Nominations Committee welcomes recommendations for qualified individuals for the following 3 year teams.

Educator Trustees - Two Positions

An Educator Trustee shall be a person who is a voting member in good standing in the Institution, Academic or Emeritus membership categories and a faculty member or administrator at a college or university, which is an Institutional Member of UAA.

Industry Trustee – One Position

An Industry Trustee shall be a person who is an individual voting member in good standing and a full-time employee of a company, government agency, or officer of a non-profit organization, which is an Industry member of UAA

Member At Large Trustee – One Position

The trustee representing the membership and the industry at large. A Trustee at Large shall be a person who is an individual voting member in good standing in any membership category. A Trustee at Large is NOT be required to be from a college or university which is an Institutional Member of the UAA

Secretary (2-year term)

The Secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the Board and shall assure that all notices are given in accordance with these Bylaws or as required bylaw. The Secretary shall implement and conduct all aspects of the actual election process. With the results to be announced at the annual meeting of the membership.

Nominations are verified for eligibility and vetted by the Nominations Committee, chaired by Samuel Pavel. The final ballot will be announced in the August newsletter with online elections open August 23rd. Each position is elected by ballot of the membership. Election results will be announced at the UAA Collegiate Aviation Education Conference October 6-8, 2021, and will join the Board of Trustees January 1, 2022.

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Winners Selected for the 2020-2021 TRB Airport Cooperative Research Program University Design Competition for Addressing Airport Needs

WASHINGTON – The Transportation Research Board's Airport Cooperative Research Program (ACRP) has selected winners for its annual University Design Competition for Addressing Airport Needs. Now in its 15th year, the prestigious competition encourages students to design innovative and practical solutions to challenges at airports. Five first-place winners were chosen across four technical challenge areas: Airport Environmental Interactions, Airport Operation and Maintenance, Runway Safety/Runway Incursions/Runway Excursions, and Airport Management and Planning.

Airport Environmental Interactions Challenge:

A team of graduate students from the College of Aeronautics at Florida Institute of Technology won first place for its proposal titled FlyKey. The students proposed a design that focuses on the implementation of technology to make the experience for the traveler convenient and safe. Faculty adviser: Deborah Carstens.

Airport Operation and Maintenance Challenge:

A team of undergraduate and graduate students from San Jose State University's Aviation and Technology Department won first place for its proposal titled Conceptual Design of Vertiport and UAM Corridor. The team proposed a schematic design of a vertiport with a surface footprint of 340 ft² to increase consumer benefits by increasing accessibility and operational efficiency of the vertiport. Faculty adviser: Wenbin Wei.

Runway Safety/Runway Incursions/Runway Excursions Challenge:

A team of undergraduate students from Michigan Technological University captured first place for its proposal titled Graphical NOTAM Interface for Improving Efficiency of Reporting NOTAM Information. The team developed an Electronic Flight Bag user interface that provides a graphical representation of a notice to airmen (NOTAM) and weather information to improve how pilots receive condition changes at airports. Faculty adviser: Audra Morse.

Airport Management and Planning Challenge:

An undergraduate team from the University of California, Berkeley, tied for first place for its proposal titled High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) Traffic Management Concept on Airfields: Increasing Airport Capacity and Reducing Passenger Delay. The design proposal offered outside-of-the-box thinking to help solve the issue of airfield congestion utilizing HOV methods. Faculty adviser: Jasenka Rakas.

The second first-place winner was a team of undergraduate and graduate students from the University of Utah for its proposal titled Automatic Independent Video-based Air Traffic Surveillance System (AIVATS). The students presented a much needed and innovative design for an automatic system that would monitor air traffic at non-towered airports. Faculty adviser: Abbas Rashidi.

In addition, teams from Pennsylvania State University and Michigan Technological University won second-place awards, a team from Purdue University won a third-place award, and teams from Purdue University, Florida Institute of Technology, and Pennsylvania State University received honorable mentions.

Students were invited to propose innovations in any of the four technical challenge areas. The Virginia Space Grant Consortium of Hampton, Virginia, manages the competition on behalf of the ACRP. Funding for the competition is provided by the Federal Aviation Administration.

Volunteer panels of airport industry and academic practitioners as well as FAA representatives selected the winning submissions. First-place winners will receive their awards and present their work at a virtual awards ceremony on Aug. 4. The students will also present their designs at the virtual Airport Consultant Council's Airport Technical Workshop as a keynote presentation. Winning teams receive \$3,000 for first place, \$2,000 for second place, \$1,000 for third place, and \$500 for honorable mentions.

Flying Salukis' Ground Work Leads To Another Top 3 National Finish



CARBONDALE, Ill. – Even when grounded, the Southern Illinois University Carbondale's Flying Salukis find ways to reach new heights.

After the May 2020 National Intercollegiate Flying Association (NIFA) competition was canceled and the 2021 version whittled to a virtual format with ground events only due to the COVID-19 pandemic, SIU again showed its national prominence this past weekend by finishing third in the nation. The result marks the 10th straight year that the nine-time national champions have finished third or higher in the nation.

Embry Riddle Aeronautical University-Prescott won the title. The University of North Dakota was second.



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Two MTSU Graduates Among Four Commissioned by Air Force ROTC

MURFREESBORO, Tenn. – Two recent MTSU graduates were among four commissioned as U.S. Air Force second lieutenants during the recent spring 2021 ceremony for Air Force ROTC Detachment 790 held at Middle Tennessee State University.

The outdoor, in-person event sponsored by MTSU's Charlie and Hazel Daniels Veterans and Military Family Center took place Saturday, May 15, at the Veterans Memorial adjacent to the Tom H. Jackson Building, with the newly commissioned officers experiencing a formal sendoff as they await their Air Force careers.

"The Air Force just got better," said Lt. Col. Nick D. Callaway, professor of Aerospace Studies at TSU, who provided opening and closing comments. "The leadership shown by these young men and women in their time here was nothing short of extraordinary. They will make great leaders and phenomenal officers."

MTSU Department of Aerospace alumni Kendra Pomeroy of Milford and Paxton, Massachusetts, and Jack McPherson of Sharpsburg, Georgia, who graduated May 8, and two more commissionees were joined by family and friends at the ceremony, which included Oath of Office, First Salute, presentation of the new lieutenants and introduction by cadet Danyssa Diseker.

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Textron Aviation has Welcomed Nearly 230 College Interns to Wichita for the Summer

Textron Aviation is under way with its summer internship program, drawing students from around the country to Wichita for hands-on experience in aviation.

The company, which is a division of Rhode Island-based Textron Inc. (NYSE: TXT), says on its website that nearly 230 students took part in the program's orientation day late last month.

From there, participants are placed in roles around the company designed to give them real-world experience in aviation over the 90 days they'll be on the job.

It also opens the door for a potential career with the maker of Beechcraft and Cessna aircraft – and gives the company an important talent pipeline at a time demand for its products is rebounding quickly from the pandemic.

Deliveries of business jets by the company were up nearly 22% in the first quarter, leading to Textron to increase its financial outlook on the year in April. And there is plenty of more work in the pipeline, as Textron Aviation ended March with a backlog of \$2.1 billion.

Textron CEO Scott Donnelly has said he believes the business will be back to pre-pandemic level next year.

That will keep the manufacturer looking for workers in Wichita as business picks up, including plucking from the ranks of its interns.

The company says colleges represented in this year's summer internship program include Wichita State University, Kansas State University, the University of Kansas, Pittsburg State University the University of Oklahoma and Oklahoma State University.

Others hail from as far away as Arizona State University, Clemson University and Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in Florida.

The company earlier this week welcomed even younger students to its facilities, with the start of the Youth Employment Project that, in partnership with the Workforce Alliance of South Central Kansas, provides part-time internships for area high school students.



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CSU Student Takes First Solo Flight Under New Aeronautics Program



CHARLESTON, S.C. (WCBD) – A Charleston Southern University student made history this week by becoming the college's first aeronautics student to take a solo flight.

Harrison Hunt took flight in a Diamond DA-20 aircraft, which he called a "next level" and liberating experience.

"I was a bit anxious at first because I knew I would be by myself with no instructor as a safety net," he said. "But the feeling of accomplishment and knowing that I had taken a massive step in the direction of becoming a pilot far overshadowed that."

The college said Hunt has dreamed of being a pilot for as long as he could remember. The CSU sophomore changed his major to aeronautics from engineering during freshman year.

"I initially planned to be an engineering major to pay for flight school and later become a pilot, but when CSU announced the aeronautics program, I knew I couldn't let this chance slip through my fingers," he said.

Charleston Southern announced in August of last year it would begin offering a Bachelor of Science in aeronautics in the fall of 2021 and began offering a three-credit-hour aeronautics course – Introduction to Pilot Training – this past fall.

Students who enroll in the program can choose between three main tracks for becoming a professional pilot: commercial, military, or missionary aviation.

Colonel Christopher "C.J." Will, U.S. Air Force (retired), is the founding chair of CSU's new Aeronautics Department, which is located within the College of Science and Mathematics.

In Hunt's recorded video of the first solo flight, you may not be able to tell real from the simulated experience. Col. Will said new simulators are just that realistic.

"I love his opening narration, 'Let's get to it!'" Col. Will said of the recording. "Harrison is an outstanding student and is also doing very well in CSU's Air Force ROTC program."

Two students are now flying in the summer session; however, a full cohort begins this fall with upwards of 30 students expected in the inaugural class.

Polk State Flight Team Lands in TOP 20 at NIFA National Competition



The Polk State Flight Team recently competed in the National Intercollegiate Flying Association (NIFA) Safety and Flight Evaluation Conference (SAFECON) national aviation competition. Polk State aviators placed 20th nationally while competing against the top collegiate aviation programs in the country.

"I couldn't be prouder of our team, and to finish top 20 in the nation is a huge accomplishment," said Carl Valeri, coach of the Polk State Flight Team. "This group had to overcome unique challenges amid the pandemic and persevered with outstanding showings in both the regional and national competitions."

The previously scheduled 2020 NIFA competitions were delayed until May 2021 and were held in virtual formats due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Recent Polk State Bachelor of Science in Aerospace Sciences graduate Michael Perez Robinson who serves as an instructor with the program placed sixth in the country in the Certified Flight Instructor (CFI) portion. He also ranked among the nation's elite in the scenario-based segment.

He explained that the competitions the Flight Team participates in are approximately 80 percent groundwork and 20 percent flight time – similar to careers in aviation, he said. Competitions include written exams that test the team's knowledge in areas including safety and preflight protocols such as fueling and planning for a flight.

"Being a part of a team itself is the greatest part," he added. "Being able to get together and not only talk about what we are working on but also about our careers and ambitions is an amazing experience."

Other notable top-50 national finishes were Landen MacFarland at 35th in preflight, Isaac Castellanos 44th in aircraft recognition, and Nick Schulz 46th in simulated comprehensive aircraft navigation (SCAN).

Flight team members who competed in nationals also include Pierce Cody, Tyler Konce, Ryan Main, Landen MacFarland, and Mike Pavlik.
