RACCA Conference Agenda Fills Out

Workforce shortages, new cargo aircraft and changes to Part 135 top the agenda for the Regional Air Cargo Carriers Association conference April 21-23 at the Hilton Resort and Villas in Scottsdale, AZ. Conference registrations are brisk and hotel space is selling out.

"The Spring Conference promises to be greater than ever," President Stan Bernstein reported. "We will have an aircraft static display and hear exiting briefings on the Cessna Skycourier while TSA will brief us on changes for the cargo industry. The agenda will cover our most important issues so we can work together to develop solutions."

The conference will lead off with an inspiring presentation by Captain J. Charles Plumb who will test our perception of what defines a hero. The F4 pilot and former POW will discuss techniques needed to survive even the most debilitating of life's challenges.

The Cessna 408 SkyCourier will make its "debut" at the conference with a full briefing by Cessna and Pratt & Whitney-Canada on the developments of this purpose-built cargo aircraft which is capturing the attention of cargo and passenger airlines alike.

Following on from last year's briefings from Sabrewing, attendees will hear from Elroy Air Co-founders David Merrill and Clint Cope about its new partnership with Embraer X and its autonomous aerial delivery system for heavy cargo needed to go long distances.

In the wake of pilot and technician workforce crises, members will hear from Aviation Technician Education Council Board Member Dr. Joel English on industry efforts to change Part 147 regulations to reflect performance-based requirements and 21st Century technology. In addition, University of North Dakota Professor and Director of Aviation Industry Relations Kent Lovelace will brief delegates on what student surveys reveal about addressing the cargo carrier pilot shortage. Cargo Airline Association President Steve Alterman will provide a legislative and regulatory outlook for Washington.

Finally, RACCA President Stan Bernstein and Vice President John Hazlet will brief members on the progress of the Part 135 Duty-Rest Aviation Rulemaking Committee and what it means for cargo operators. RACCA has three members on the committee.

Because we own our planes, our program is less expensive than any other flight program in the country, and we are able to pass those savings on to our students.



UND Gives Kids the Chance to Try Out Aerospace Technology

The University Of North Dakota Aerospace Community Day is getting kids in the pilot seat and into dozens of careers using VR technology, real life space suits for NASA, and flight simulators. I even tried my hand at becoming a pilot in one of the simulations. While my chances of becoming a pilot are slim, staff are getting kids suited up and started in the field. "So they actually get a chance to sit with an instructor to give them a quick rundown on how to fly an aircraft, they do a take off, they do a landing, and then, they are a pilot for UND, sort of," Assistant Chief and Course Manager Of UND Aerospace Matt Opsahl said laughingly. UND, Opsahl says, has trained over 10 thousand pilots in the field, he says the demand is there for pilots. "As you probably have heard, there is quite a shortage of pilots right now. Starting them young and getting them with the love of aviation can really help, not only with UND, but the aerospace industry," Opsahl said.



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ExpressJet Airlines to Become World's Largest Embraer ERJ145 Aircraft Operator; Finalizing Long Term Extension with United Airlines

ExpressJet Airlines, a United Express carrier, announced it will add 36 Embraer ERJ145 aircraft to its United Express fleet, which will make ExpressJet the world's largest operator of the 50-seat Embraer ERJ145 aircraft. "We have made the long-term commitment to the Embraer ERJ145 and designed the comprehensive cabin, seat, and entertainment upgrade to deliver a contemporary customer experience," said Sarah Murphy, Senior Vice President of United Express. "We're confident that our partners at ExpressJet can execute that vision." "United's trust in ExpressJet is a testament to the dedication and adaptability of ExpressJet's employees," said Subodh Karnik, Chairman and CEO of ExpressJet Airlines. "Growing our fleet and upgrading the ERJ145s embodies our vision: 'To be the United Express carrier that best understands and fulfills the needs of United Airlines.'" As part of the long-term commitment to the Embraer ERJ145 and growth of the fleet, ExpressJet will announce additions to its crew bases and facilities at United hubs, including Denver, in the coming weeks. As part of the agreement, ExpressJet will also phase out their small fleet of E175 aircraft to speed-up growth and become an efficient single-fleet airline.

Independent Program Reviews

Purpose of a Program Review

Reviews are a voluntary process whose major purpose is to ensure quality in a collegiate aviation program. The aim of a program review and on-site visit is to assess how well an institute implements its own mission, adheres to its internal and external guidelines, and how it will comply with its program requirements. The on-site visit plan is cooperative. All programs are expected to meet or exceed all standards of collegiate institutional accreditation. The integrity of an institution and the program is fundamental and critical to the quality training process. Programs must continually evaluate themselves in relation to their institution's mission and their own program mission, goals, and educational objectives. Collegiate aviation is part of a slowly evolving, continuous process. In the long view, there are continuing conversations among training programs, students, faculty professionals, institutions, and end-consumers (employers).

Services Provided by UAA

The UAA program review will include an in-depth evaluation and report on all areas that contribute to or are a factor in a viable aviation program. The review will include, but not necessarily be limited to, the following areas: Administration, Financial Resources, Learning Resources, Faculty, Support Personnel, Student Services, Facilities, Instructional Support, Student Body, and Curricula.

Reviewers

Typically, three reviewers are assigned to conduct a program review. At the institution's option, additional reviewers, including a representative of the aviation industry may be included on the review team. The reviewers are selected on the basis of their academic credentials and industry experience that relates to the aviation program.

Time Requirements

The typical visit involves two days on site for interviewing administrators, faculty, students and industry representatives and gathering data not available in the material furnished in advance. An additional day should be allowed for follow-up and preparation of the report.

Report

The end product of the review will be a comprehensive report that is prepared by the reviewers and edited by the UAA HQ.

Cost of Review

The cost of the review will be based on the services requested by the institution. Typical reviews cost \$5,000 (including stipends). Additional costs include: direct costs of travel and lodging, communication, postage, copying.

Initiating a Review by UAA

To initiate a review, the institutional representative should complete the UAA Program Review Request Form or send a letter to UAA indicating the purpose of the review, the areas to be included, and time frame. UAA will respond with confirmation of cost estimate, proposed times and available team members. Address your questions to hello@uaa.aero.





