A Day in the Life of an Aircraft Maintenance Engineer



Inspections, troubleshooting, and documentation are essential responsibilities of aircraft maintenance engineers.

In order to keep aircraft flying around the clock, aircraft maintenance engineers must work continuously. Most aviation maintenance sites operate three shifts in a 24-hour period. Aircraft engineers typically begin their day by reviewing ongoing work schedules, task lists from previous shifts, and maintenance records.

Incoming work briefings and shop floor management (SFM) meetings are generally held at the beginning of the shift. Teams discuss ongoing issues, tasks for the day, and any critical deviations necessary for the ongoing projects. The team also discusses nearterm work priorities during the earlyshift briefings. Aircraft engineers gather sufficient information about the tasks for the day and begin their plan of action.

The Boeing Technician Outlook,

North America points to a need for 134,000 qualified aircraft maintenance technicians before 2041. U.S. Bureau of Labor and Statistics projects 13,000 annual job openings for aviation maintenance and avionics positions over the next decade. Aspiring technicians enter this rewarding career field with an average annual salary of \$65,550 while incurring significantly less student loan debt than four-year programs.

MGSU Aviation Students Soar to New Heights with \$50,000 Grant for Cutting-Edge Equipment



Middle Georgia State University (MGSU) aviation students will be flying high after receiving a \$50,000 grant from Gulfstream Aerospace. The grant will serve as a significant boost to MGSU's efforts to provide state-of-the-art equipment for its students that will enhance their educational experience.

The Chair of the Aviation Maintenance and Structural Technology Department, Martin Kehayes, said the university has two aircraft maintenance programs that prepare students with skills that allow them to work in the aviation industry. "The equipment that we got will help us to teach one facet of aircraft maintenance which is the repair of composite structure so fiberglass, carbon fiber, which is being used more and more in the aviation industry as a structural material. We definitely want to improve and develop how we teach that and how we prepare our students," said Kehayes.

The university recognizes the importance of offering students practical training opportunities and ensuring they are well-equipped to meet the demands of the industry upon graduation. Kehayes said the university's goal as the program continues to grow is to have every student who goes through the aircraft maintenance program be AirFrame and Powerplant Certified by graduation.

"We averaged about 70-80 students and over the last five years we've grown to about 130-140 so tremendous growth. Having that grant and being able to get this additional equipment allows us to be more effective in giving them the exposure to composite repair," said Kehayes.

SIU Saluki Aces Finish Second in 2023 Air Race Classic



Trusting their instincts and making smart decisions to overcome difficult weather paid off last week for Southern Illinois University Carbondale Aviation's Saluki Aces Meadow Boden and Graci McDaniel.

The pair finished second – both overall and in the collegiate division - of the 46th transcontinental Air Race Classic the four-day, 2,334 nautical mile journey from Grand Forks, North Dakota, to Homestead, Florida, June 20-23. The 2023 event, which honors female aviators. featured 41 teams of competitors of all ages and experience levels this year, including 14 universities.

Racing with a unique handicap and against their own best time, Boden and McDaniel made several decisions during their journey that helped propel them to SIU's second-highest overall finish in eight years of competing. A team from SIU won both the overall and collegiate title in 2015. Results are available on the Air Race Classic website.

"Sitting in the awards banquet, we were in shock that we did as well as we did," she said. "I was never expecting to be in the top 10 of all the racers. We ultimately just focused on not getting penalties and doing our best. I'm still in shock, and it is a major highlight of my life. We couldn't have done it without each other, and we are so proud to be Salukis!"

Competitors included trainees on Boeing 777s, retired air traffic controllers, fixed base operator (FBO) airport owners and collegiate teams. Competing against women of these different backgrounds is one of Boden's greatest experiences.

"Placing second among the 41 teams showed that no matter your background, you really can do anything," said Boden, of Bushnell, a 2022 SIU graduate and certified flight instructor in the program.

Fedex Pilots Reject New Contract



Thousands of FedEx pilots represented by the Air Line Pilots Association rejected a tentative agreement recently reached between the company and the union.

The union's Master Executive Council announced Monday, July 24, that FedEx pilots voted against the agreement by a vote of 57% to 43%.

"Our members have spoken and we will now regroup and prepare for the next steps," Chris Norman, FedEx ALPA chair, said in a statement Monday.

The voting period on the agreement opened Wednesday, July 5, and ended Monday, July 24. ALPA and FedEx announced in May a tentative agreement following two years of negotiations.

"The tentative agreement voting results have no impact on our service as we

continue delivering for our customers around the world," FedEx said in a statement Monday.

FedEx said Monday that both parties will return to negotiations under the supervision of the National Mediation Board.

"However, there is no time requirement for this to occur," Norman said Monday.

In October 2022, FedEx and ALPA jointly asked the National Mediation Board to help expedite the then-ongoing negotiations through its mediation services.

"While we are disappointed in these voting results, FedEx will continue to bargain in good faith with our pilots to achieve an agreement that is fair for all FedEx stakeholders," FedEx's statement reads.

ALPA leadership says it will meet to establish a timeline for assessing "pilot group priorities" moving forward.

FedEx and ALPA last signed a contract in 2015, which became amendable in November 2021.

Negotiations for a new contract began in May 2021.

For the past two years, ALPA has publicly called for a new contract that increases hourly pay and retirement benefits, as well as one that better considers issues relating to "quality of life."

In May, frustrated by a lack of an agreement, ALPA announced its members had voted to strike if necessary to achieve a new labor agreement.

With more than 97% of the ALPA members participating, 99% of FedEx pilots authorized union leaders to call a strike if needed.

Before a strike could take place, the National Mediation Board must first decide that additional mediation efforts would not be productive and offer the parties an opportunity to arbitrate the contract dispute.

If either side declines the arbitration, both parties would enter a 30-day "cooling off" period, after which the parties could then engage in self-help, or a strike by the union or a lockout by management.

"FedEx pilots remain unified, and that will drive a new path that will help produce an agreement that all FedEx pilots will be proud to support," Norman said Monday.

For more than a century, the National Intercollegiate Flying Association (NIFA) has inspired collegiate aviators to strive for excellence through competition. NIFA's history stretches back to post-World War I, when collegiate flying clubs organized their first intercollegiate competition in 1920.

This year, 28 teams representing nine regional competitions competed in the annual SAFECON National Championship in Oshkosh, Wisconsin. Team members put their skills to the test in flying, navigation, knowledge, and mathematical computation—all while knowing their school's legacy was on the line.

FLYING was there to capture the excitement and bring the inspiring stories of competitors and volunteers to light.

Vision Jet Gets New Radar and Cirrus IQ Mobile App

Cirrus Aircraft is adding a pair of features to its Vision Jet to improve situational awareness and connectivity for pilots. The company on Wednesday announced that Garmin's Auto Radar will now be a feature of the light jet, along with the Cirrus IQ mobile app.

Auto Radar allows pilots to select their desired radar range and then scans airspace and displays a composite, realtime depiction of weather conditions. By automatically selecting an optimal horizontal scan pattern and vertical tilt combination, the system creates an indepth view of the weather ahead with automatic ground-clutter suppression.

Meanwhile, the Cirrus IQ app helps pilots proactively check key aircraft readiness items that can be updated after each flight. These include fuel and oxygen supply levels, the aircraft location, flight hours, and engine cycles.

The app is available as part of the JetStream contract offered to owners, and Cirrus intends to make both new features available for retrofit on older aircraft.

NextGen at ERAU Helps Lead FAA Live Flight Demonstration

The NextGen (Next Generation Air Transportation System) Florida Test Bed (FTB) at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University led a U.S. team that recently took part in a successful, first-of-itskind joint effort to share and coordinate trajectory information and achieve optimal flight paths across multiple countries.

The six-day live flight demonstration, organized by the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), included four unique scenarios and flights between the United States, Japan, Singapore and Thailand.

"The goal of the demonstration was to test new aviation technologies designed to enhance communication, flight efficiency and safety," explained Embry-Riddle FTB Director of Advanced Programs Kirsten Kasper.
