Embry-Riddle's Golden Eagles Flight Team Wins 15th National Championship

Embry-Riddle's Golden Eagles Flight Team brought home first-place gold from the 2023 National Intercollegiate Flying Association's Safety and Flight Evaluation Conference, tallying the team's third consecutive championship and 15th overall.

ERAU Golden Eagles Flight Team Wins 15th National Championship

After more than 25 days of cross-country flying and competition, Embry-Riddle's Golden Eagles Flight Team returned home to Prescott, Arizona --- elated and victorious.

As they exited their aircraft, some for the last time as graduating seniors, there were cheers, hugs and applause for the returning champs. The team had achieved an amazing feat: defending its team national championship title, capturing its third consecutive and 15th overall win at the 2023 National Intercollegiate Flying Association (NIFA) Safety and Flight Evaluation Conference.

"All year long we've been saying impossible means I'm possible," said the team's Head Coach Shaun Shephard. "And we went out there and did exactly what we needed to do with safety, focus and precision." Doswell Foundation recognize that women have been historically underrepresented in aviation and our shared commitment has led to the creation of the Doswell School of Aeronautical Sciences," board Chairwoman Stacie McDavid said.

The Golden Eagles soared to first place out of 28 university teams at the competition held May 8-13 in Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

"Our flight team is representative of the quality of students that Embry-Riddle attracts," said Prescott Campus Chancellor Dr. Anette Karlsson. "They are dedicated to their future professions and willing to spend the extra time to become the best."

It takes a tremendous amount of training and practice to compete at the national level. The travel team represents the best of the best. Only 18 out of the team's 40+ members are selected to go.

"Anyone who knows this team has seen their commitment and service to each other," said Dr. Tim Holt, dean of the College of Aviation at Prescott. "The time and dedication it takes is second to none."

The competition includes flying and ground events, such as flight planning, navigation, aircraft recognition, precision landings and message drops. In addition to being named champions of the flight events, the Golden Eagles also earned second place overall in ground events.

Individual National Champion



Leading the team to victory was Hayden Morse, the top pilot overall and top-scoring contestant as well as the short-field landing champion. Morse, who is from Scottsdale, Arizona, joined the Golden Eagle Flight Team in 2020. Since then, he has been part of three championship teams and competed in numerous events.

Last year, he won the power off landing and short field landing competition which catapulted the Golden Eagles to its second straight national championship. "Hayden is a hard worker and very humble," said Shephard. "He is a great leader and teacher, always willing to help others."

U.S. Navy Selects Students for 2023 Summer Flight Academy



The U.S. Navy has chosen 28 high school students from across the country to attend its eight-week 2023 Summer Flight Academy aviation program. The program includes approximately 40 hours of flight training in either a Vulcanair V.10 or Piper Warrior as well as aviationoriented classroom work. Students selected for the academy, which was established in 2021 by Commander, Naval Air Forces (CNAF), attend for free with no obligations to the military.

"The primary goal of the CNAF Flight Academy is to expose diverse, young talent to Naval Aviation, and inspire them to join the profession," said CNAF Operations Officer for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, and CNAF Flight Academy Program Manager Lt. Olivia Barrau.

Academy students finish the program with a private pilot certificate and college credit from Delaware State University (DSU), Elizabeth City State University (ECSU) or D2 Aviation School. According to the Navy, around 70 percent of the Summer Flight Academy's alumni are now directly affiliated with the U.S. military.

Southwest Airlines Welcomes Four Universities into Destination 225°

Southwest Airlines recently welcomed four new universities into Destination 225°, the airline's development and recruitment program that creates a pathway for qualified aviators to a First Officer position at Southwest.

Baylor University, Louisiana Tech, Middle Tennessee State University, and Oklahoma State University are the newest partners in Destination 225°, growing the number of university partners in the program to 11.

Destination 225° University Pathway Candidates build post-graduate flight instructing time within their college's flight program, with the goal of becoming competitively qualified to interview for a First Officer role at one of the program's partner carriers. After building their flying experience at a partner carrier, Southwest Airlines considers Candidates for a First Officer position. Candidates receive ongoing career mentorship from a Southwest Pilot during their university studies and early flying career.

The four Universities join fellow Destination 225° University Partners Auburn, Angelo State University, Arizona State University, Southeastern Oklahoma State University, Texas Southwest University, University of Nebraska at Omaha, and the University of Oklahoma. These University Partners work with Southwest to train and support collegiate aviators accepted into the Destination 225° University Pathway.

While working, MTSU aerospace grad flies over commencement



Tony Briotta would've enjoyed attending Middle Tennessee State University's May 5 commencement to personally receive his master's degree, but he was working.

And, you could say he was just 45,000 feet from graduation and Murphy Center, where four total commencements found more than 2,650 fellow students graduating during the course of two days.

As a Gulfstream Aerospace Corp. test pilot based out of Savannah, Georgia, Briotta and a co-pilot headed west and eventually toward Nashville, Tennessee, that day on a five-hour up-and-back mission.

While working, recent MTSU graduate Tony Briotta pilots a Gulfstream test plane past Murphy Center and Murfreesboro, TN, on Friday, May 5 the day he earned a master's degree in Aeronautical Sciences from the university at Mach .85 speed (652 mph).

Since the graduate courses are offered online, Craig rarely meets his students in person, but he met Briotta and other MTSU alumni working for Gulfstream when they flew to Smyrna Airport as part of the March Aerospace Expo.

House Releases Sweeping FAA Reauthorization Package



The leadership of the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee and aviation subcommittee unveiled their nearly 800 page FAA reauthorization package today, addressing further FAA reforms, enhanced aviation safety, general aviation, workforce growth, and airport infrastructure support.

Importantly, the bill, the Securing Growth and Robust Leadership in American Aviation Act, would reauthorize the FAA's operating authority for five years, providing continuity at an agency that is undergoing a transition after several tumultuous years. Congress is facing a 9/30 deadline to complete work on a reauthorization package before the current FAA operating authority expires.

As promised by T&I Chairman Sam Graves (R-Missouri), the bill has an entire title dedicated to general aviation—a first in a reauthorization bill—with measures addressing everything from expanding BasicMed and data privacy to protecting GA airports from closure and ADS-B incentives.

Further, the bill takes aim at one of the chief complaints from the business and general aviation community: a lack of FAA resources to timely address certification, inspection, check airman availability, and other necessary services. Measures touch upon Part 135 check airman reform as well as the air carrier certification backlog and policy consistencies, among other areas.

Another title is squarely focused on growing that talent pipeline for the aviation workforce, addressing development, training, and retention.

Perhaps underscoring the importance to the committee, the bill's first title is not only dedicated to the actual authorization of the agency but the reform of it as well. Other areas are dedicated to airport infrastructure and myriad provisions covering aviation safety, including one addressing Part 135 flight and duty time. Another key part of the bill is dedicated to "aerospace innovation" that looks to help safely foster advanced air mobility and other such emerging technologies. Passenger protections and a range of other measures, including those affecting the National Transportation Safety Board, were also included.

"For over a century, the U.S. has led the world in aviation safety and innovation, but our 'Gold Standard' status is being threatened by increasing global competition, rapid developments in technology, a shortage of aviation professionals, and FAA's own inefficiency," Graves said in introducing the reauthorization package. "Our bipartisan legislation will improve critical infrastructure for airports of all sizes, streamline the FAA bureaucracy. strengthen the nation's general aviation sector, encourage the more rapid deployment of safe technological innovations, and address workforce challenges throughout the aviation system."

A state-of-the-art flight trainer has been built to order in the maxed-out configuration, greatly exceeding minimum requirements, to provide immersive training for airline pilots.

President Signs Legislation to Modernize NOTAM System

President Joe Biden signed H.R. 346 on June 3, 2023, a bipartisan law designed to update the FAA's Notice to Air Mission (NOTAM) system. The legislation comes after the NOTAM system crashed in January 2023, grounding domestic flights across the United States.

The modernization is also expected to improved accuracy and accessibility for pilots, according to FAA officials.

The new law requires the FAA to set up a task force made up of all representatives of the aviation industry, including general aviation. Its mission:

- Review existing methods for publishing NOTAMs and flight operations information for pilots
- Review regulations, policies, systems, and international standards relating to NOTAMs, including their content and presentation to pilots
- Evaluate and determine best practices to organize, prioritize, and present flight operations information in a manner that optimizes pilot review and retention of relevant information

Paris Air Show FULL of Surprises



Elixir Aircraft unveils its decarbonized aircraft running on biofuel or hydrogen. On the occasion of the Paris Air Show, Elixir Aircraft unveiled its prototype for a low-carbon propulsion aircraft at the Paris Air Lab. Developed as part of a CORAC program in collaboration with Air Liquide, Safran, Daher and Turbotech, the aim of this program is to accelerate the market launch of innovative, more environmentally-friendly aircraft powered firstly by biofuel and then by hydrogen. Discover this aircraft on the static display of the "Paris Air Lab" stand B3.

Elixir Aircraft has set itself the mission of decarbonizing general aviation, while retaining the advantages it brings. It's a mission that the company has decided to tackle pragmatically, with the question: what "clean" energies will enable light aircraft to carry out their missions in the future?

There are several answers to this question, and choices have to be made. Will the solution be electric, with batteries? Hydrogen with a fuel cell? Hybrid electric? Thermal hydrogen (liquid, gas?)? Thermal biofuel (which?)?

Faced with these questions, Elixir Aircraft has chosen its positio. First of all, biofuels such as aviation kerosene (SAF) and then liquid hydrogen.

Ultimately, the future is dictated by what works today. Commercial aviation has been moving towards biofuels for 15 years, and rightly so. This high-energy-density fuel does not change engines, pilot training, maintenance or distribution methods... It just needs to be mass-produced. Given the sheer volume of fuel needed to power commercial aviation,

it's reasonable to assume that one or more energy suppliers will eventually be able to produce it in quantity and at a reasonable price. As SAF is already distributed to airports worldwide, this choice of fuel seems to Elixir Aircraft to be the best compromise for the future of its propulsion.

Elixir Aircraft is therefore in the process of integrating Turbotech's TP90 turbine, running on biofuel (SAF), into its 4th-generation aircraft. This aircraft, currently under development, is being unveiled for the first time at the Paris Air Show, on stand B3 "Paris Air Lab".

Liquid hydrogen as a complement to SAF propulsion is a choice that, while far from mature, makes sense. Many manufacturers are interested, including producers/distributors (Air Liquide), and the technological building blocks are available (storage, combustion, distribution). All that remains is to clear the way to integrate the whole system into a device, make it reliable and certify it. This is what the members of the CORAC hydrogen consortium are working on.

Using Sustainable Aviation Fuel



Ultimately, Sustainable fuel for aviation isn't just for aeroplanes; helicopters love it too - While we eagerly await the day when electric vertical take-off and landing (eVTOL) vehicles can fully replace traditional rotorcraft, existing helicopters can still make a significant environmental impact by embracing sustainably-sourced alternative fuel.

This shift towards SAF in helicopters is gaining momentum, reducing their carbon footprint and paving the way for a greener future in aviation.

In fact Colin James, Airbus Helicopters's managing director in China, made remarks on this, "I am proud that our customer, SGST, launched this noteworthy SAF flight with the H125, marking Airbus Helicopters as the first helicopter manufacturer to perform an SAF flight in China."

Automated Aircraft Inspections Will Soon Be Commonplace

Aircraft are regularly inspected for a lot of reasons. Pilots do a walk-around before each flight, and when the plane is having maintenance done a much more detailed inspection is often made. Inspections can discover problems on the surface of the plane, like bird damage, pits, or cracks. It can also discover issues not immediately visible with scanning. Doing a complete inspection takes many hours and can be a bit dangerous, as inspectors must use support to see on the top of the fuselage or bend over to see lower parts of the aircraft. This a labor and time intensive activity.

The world is changing, as we know. While parents may be nervous about their kids using ChatGPT, some smart Al-focused brains have put their attention to the aircraft inspection problem. The result is now a smart drone, that can fly all around the airplane, high and low, in a fraction of the time it takes people to look. It can inspect and store the exact digitization of the aircraft, providing reports on what it finds both as absolute and compared with its last scan. This automated inspection is what every airline will be using before long.

US Weighs Measure For Crash Proof Video Recorders in Cockpits



A new eye in the sky might monitor US airline flights in the near future: crashproof video recorders in cockpits.

After years of controversy and pushback by pilot unions, House leaders from both parties have opted to require video to monitor air crews' actions to give accident investigators greater insights after accidents.

The measure is contained in a 773-page bill setting US aviation policy for the next five years. The provisions are a consensus of both the Republicans who control the House and Democrats – and both sides are eager to pass the legislation soon. If passed, the provision would mark a sea change in how accident investigators approach crashes and would likely lead other nations to follow suit.


