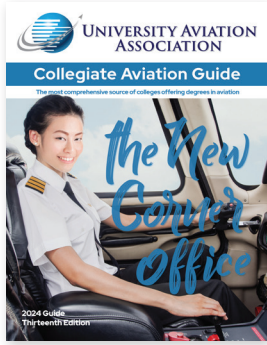

The **Collegiate Aviation Guide** is a directory of departments in the U.S., Puerto Rico, Canada, and abroad that offer academic degrees and/or majors in aviation. The institutions listed in this Guide are accredited by a regional or national accrediting organization as a degree granting institution and/or are listed in the 2024 edition of the Higher Education Directory. The intent of this Guide is

to serve as a useful reference to prospective undergraduate and graduate students, as well as educators, and industry and government personnel. For high school students and parents in search of a college or university, we suggest using the Guide as an initial screening device to identify those institutions and locales that are appropriate for the student's educational goals and individual needs. Students should then contact the institutions directly for detailed, current information. As part of the process of finding the perfect program, study the information available from several institutions, then follow-up with a personal a personal visit to the institutions. The final decision should be based on consideration of all factors that relate to the individual student.



The **Collegiate Aviation Scholarship Catalog** represents colleges and universities that offer academic degree programs in aviation at both the undergraduate and graduate level.

The purpose of this publication is to consolidate the publicly available information concerning collegiate aviation scholarships in one document. It is expected that the university aviation student, students' parents,

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Cochise College Provides Training and Connectivity for Private Flights



The Cochise College Main Campus in Douglas supports on an aviation program that features a public use airstrip running along the north side of the campus.

Cochise College Director of Aviation Programs Belinda Burnett described Cochise College's airstrip.

"We are roughly 60 feet wide and about 5,100 feet long," she said. "From the Arizona Department of Transportation, we are categorized as a small rural airport which limits the size of aircraft that can come in here based upon the runway width and obviously the runway length. But even more importantly than that is what the structure is underneath, for weight capacity. So we cannot put anything over, about 14,000 pounds on our runway."

The college has offered flight instruction since the 1960s, originally bussing students to Bisbee-Douglas International Airport for lessons. Cochise College then built its own airstrip, which was dirt for several years. The college's programs have featured avionics and airframe and powerplant mechanic training programs at several points in program history.

She said that becoming a commercial airline pilot is something that around 80% of the Cochise College graduates move on to pursue, with most other graduates pursuing careers in law enforcement, military, or corporate aviation.

The program is capped at 40 students, and usually filled to capacity. Burnett said that even if every flight school in the country were at full capacity, there would still likely be a pilot shortage in commercial airlines.

Douglas Campus Dean Abe Villarreal explained the impact of the flight program on the Campus.

"We have about 1,000 students that come (to the campus). Some students come for their general education studies right out of the college- that's a majority of our students. "

Kentucky Bill Would Create Scholarships for Aviation Education



A bill making its way through the legislature aims to make it more affordable to get training for aerospace jobs. As the world faces a shortage of pilots, mechanics, and other aviation workers, students here in Kentucky could soon be eligible for new scholarships.

Flight schools across Kentucky have been busy these last few years. A wave of airline pilot retirements has created increasing demand for new pilots over the next several years. Boeing forecasts North America will need 127,000 new pilots between now and 2042.

"Airlines are parking jets every day because they don't have pilots to captain them," said Kelli Gillispie, the director of office operations for NexGen Aviation at Blue Grass Airport.





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Westosha Central High School Aviation Club Ready to Take Flight

A fundraiser is underway to help fund scholarships as part of the Westosha Central STEM Aviation Program's Eagles Nest Project.

"It not only supports STEM education through a practical, engaging approach but also ignites a passion for aviation in these students. Every task they undertake, from hammering rivets to learning complex concepts, steers them closer to their dreams of flight," the group stated in a prepared release. "Moreover, the sweepstakes fosters a sense of community among individuals passionate about aviation and education, thereby creating a supportive network for the next generation of aviators."

The school's Aviation Club, formed in 2014, teaches students how to build and fly aircraft. Funds from the sweepstakes will go toward the aviation program, which provides scholarships for students in the program pursuing further aviation education.

FAA Sends MEM \$16M for Airport Improvements

The U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Aviation Administration will award \$16.1 million to Memphis International Airport as part of the fiscal year 2024 Airport Infrastructure Grants.

The FAA awarded \$243.7 million to airports in 37 states. The funds can be used to modernize infrastructure, improve runway safety and create jobs.

In Memphis, the grant will fund part of the terminal modernization program, which involves rebuilding the drive leading to the terminal, enlarging and updating the ticketing and baggage areas, expanding the security checkpoint, upgrading security and adding seismic enhancements.

In all, the modernization will reconfigure 40,000 square feet of facilities and offices to the terminal that looks like it did when it opened on June 7, 1963.

Elevator shafts and escalators will be moved, eliminating obstacles that constrict the flow of traffic. Ticketing counters, which all have digital signage,

will be made into universal desks so that when one airline is busy, agents can quickly open another counter.

General Dewitt Spain Airport and Charles W. Baker Airport will receive \$294,000 each for infrastructure improvements.

This funding is vital to MEM's upcoming terminal modernization project," said Terry Blue, Memphis Shelby County Airport Authority president and CEO.

"It will also benefit our general aviation operations by helping to fund the construction of a new terminal at Charles W. Baker Airport and additional infrastructure projects at General Dewitt Spain Airport.

The work on the terminal itself is scheduled between 2026-2030.

The peripheral projects that make the modernization possible at MEM will begin this year with demolition of the road in front of the airport now designated for commercial traffic – buses, taxis, Uber and Lyft vehicles. It will be configured to eventually be the main entry to the terminal.

Canada Student Takes a Flight to His College Twice A Week



A University of British Columbia student is making headlines after sharing that he flies to his college twice a week to avoid paying rent. Notably, Tim Chen, who is a resident of Calgary, says that opting for flights to his classes is cheaper than paying monthly rent in Vancouver. He only takes two classes per week at the university.

The student roughly spends \$150 per round-trip flight, which comes to almost \$1200 per month. Meanwhile, a one-bedroom apartment in Vancouver would cost him around \$2100 for the rent.

While some users were impressed with his decision, others felt that the frequent air commutes would be too hectic and time-consuming.

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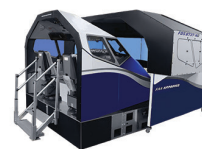

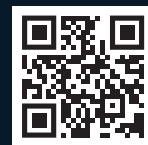
